Vidi aquam ('I saw water')

The priest introduces the Asperges (Blessing and Sprinkling of holy water) and the people are sprinkled as we recall our baptismal promises.

The priest then pronounces the absolution.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
